The program

The program will focus on the following topics:

- the Native Title Act application process, including the claim process, progressing the application, consent determinations, appeals and alternative settlements
- connection, including maintenance of traditional law and custom, overlap, shared country, succession, proof of rights and interest, State/territory guidelines
- fieldwork methods including collecting and recording evidence, and recording and presenting genealogical information
- writing reports, including connection reports
- spatial technology and mapping in native title
- data storage and access
- acting as an expert witness.
